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YOU WANT A PERFECT WEDDING, but do you see yourself dressed realistically? Not everyone can pull off the Cinderella look with the full skirt, and yet, that's how everyone romanticises their ultimate fairytale wedding.

As beauty comes in all shapes and sizes, so do gowns. Here are the basic four cuts and how to know what's the right one for you:

Ballgown: Ah, the ultimate fairytale look! But this only looks great on brides who have average-height or are tall. Petite brides should be careful: a ballgown with too full a skirt could overwhelm her appearance. Remember Princess Diana? Height and leanness works well for this silhouette.

Empire Waistline: This silhouette, with a high waistline just under the bust, works to give the less well-endowed instant uplift where it matters. Because the focus is more on the bodice rather than the skirt, petite brides will love the style as it gives the impression of increased height. It also downplays the waist and stomach area and provides more slimming curves.

Basque Waistline: This waistline cuts low on the hips to give you more curves at the hips. It has a V-shape or curved U-shape waist that fits the waist snugly before the dress flares out or falls into a straight skirt. The style has a 'slimming' effect for all body types. However, petite brides need to be a little cautious: if the waistline rides too low, it could make them appear shorter. One thing to remember about this style: the angle from hip to point in front can vary. Nowadays, they can also take on an asymmetrical look.

The Princess Line/A-line: It's the all-round silhouette for most body shapes. The style, which has a fitted bodice and flares from the hips down, can make shorter brides appear taller, and hides large hips perfectly. The lines give curves to a straight figure and is perfect for that feminine look without the bulk of a ballgown skirt.

Finally...

You may feel that there would never be a style that suits you. But think positive: personality plays a part in pulling off a style. And since this is going to be your wedding day, have fun, be confident and the rest will take care of itself.
